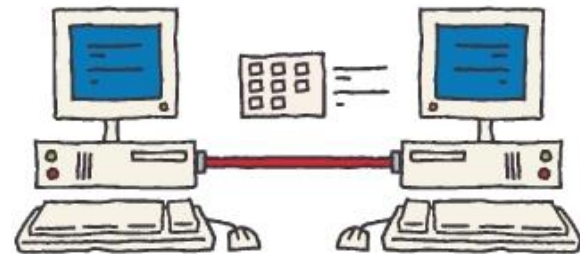

EDI

(Electronic Data Interchange)

Electronic transfer of **structured data** between computer systems by remote data transmission, ideally without any human intervention.

- **Structured data** are characterised by a precise determination of their:
 - **Syntax** (Arrangement of the characters)
 - **Semantics** (Meaning of the characters)

- The GS1 eCom standards provide the common language used in EDI
 - Structured data (e.g. identification keys)
 - Message standards

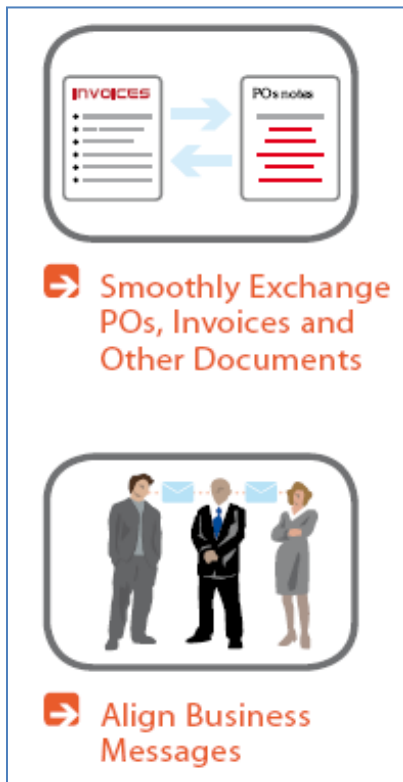


GS1 eCom standards are **MULTISECTORAL**



GS1 XML standards provide solutions for multiple sectors using the same XML business message.

This is achieved through context driven extensions applied to general GS1 eCom, such as food industry, entertainment, office supply, textile ..etc.



The right way to do eBusiness

- By using GS1 eCom standards a standardised and predictable structure of electronic business messages is provided
- Business partners do not have to negotiate the format and structure of their messages

1 ***GS1 EANCOM[®]***

2 ***GS1 XML***



GS1 eCom and other global standards

GS1 eCom standards are compliant with UN/CEFACT

- **GS1 EANCOM**[®] is a subset of UN/EDIFACT, developed and maintained by UN/CEFACT
- **GS1 XML** standards are developed based on the same principles as UN/CEFACT
- GS1 is actively participating in the development of EDIFACT and the future UN/CEFACT XML standard (UN/XML)
- GS1 is recognised by the United Nations as a non-governmental organisation, like World Customs Organisation (WCO) or SWIFT

What is GS1 EANCOM[®] ?

- EANCOM[®] is a GS1 EDI standard, being a subset of UN/EDIFACT, which comprises a set of internationally agreed standards, directories and guidelines for the electronic interchange of data
- **EANCOM[®] provides the message elements relevant for GS1 users (Subset)**
- EANCOM[®] incorporates GS1 standards of physical identification of trade items, logistics units and trading partners integrating the physical flow of goods with information sent electronically

What is GS1 XML?

- The XML technology has been primarily designed for information exchange over the internet
- Within GS1 eCom set of standards, XML is used for electronic exchange of business messages
- GS1 provides a set of XML schemas that describe the structure and content of business document

Why GS1 XML if EANCOM[®] was already there?



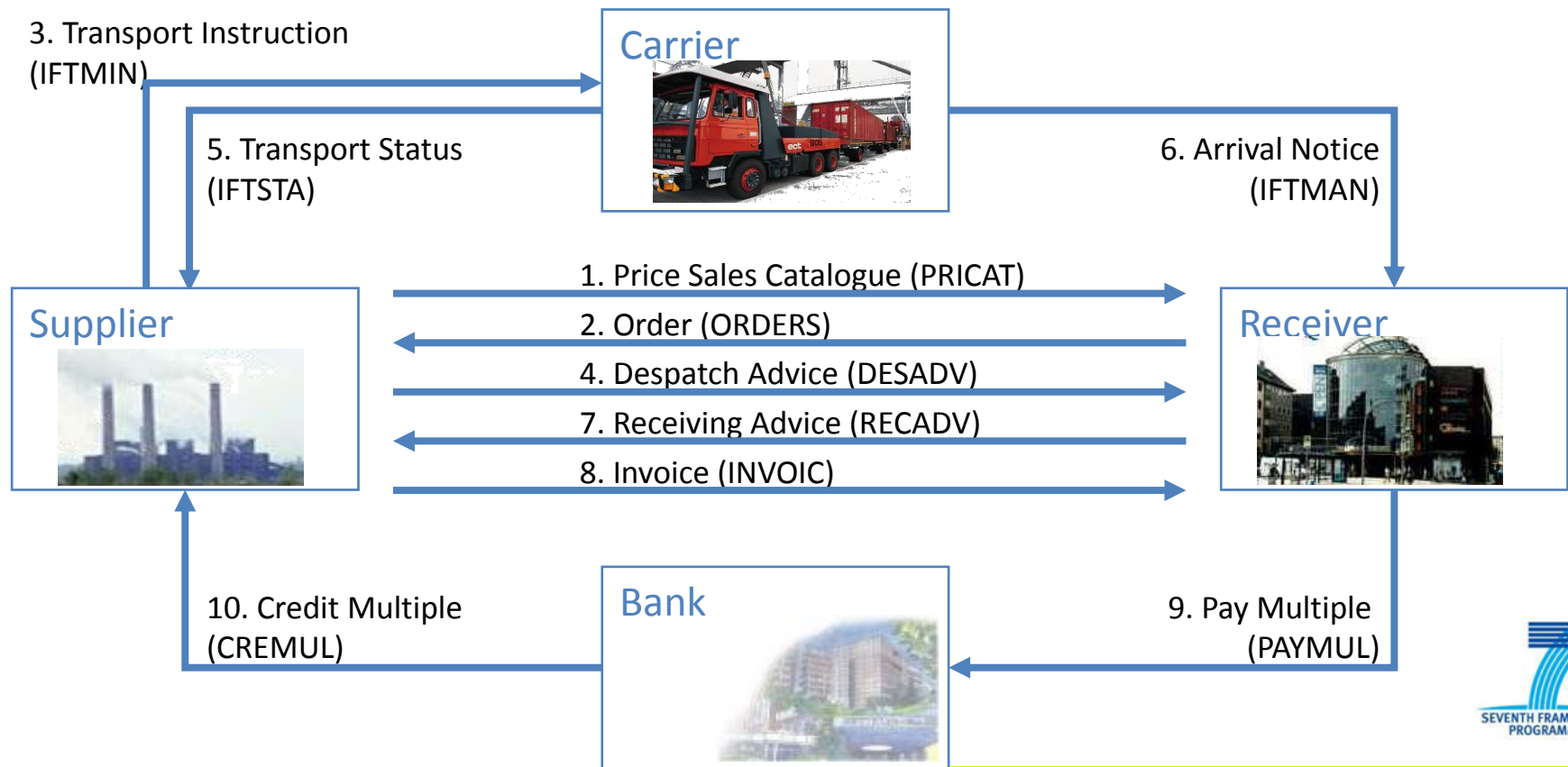
- EANCOM[®] was the first eCom standard developed by GS1 and existed before the new possibilities of the internet emerged – it is exchanged using the dedicated networks (VAN)
- EANCOM[®] is implemented mainly by large companies that represent a relatively small percentage of all existing businesses
- Therefore the market needed additional ways of electronic communication using the internet, easily accessible for smaller enterprises
- Today, GS1 maintains EANCOM[®] as well as GS1 XML

The eCom business messages can be divided into the following categories:



- **Master Data** Alignment
 - e.g. Party Information and Product Information messages
- Business **transaction** messages
 - e.g. order messages, delivery process messages, financial messages
- **General** messages
 - e.g. Receipt Acknowledgement (XML), Report and Planning (EANCOM), etc.
- **Security** messages
 - e.g. Digital signature
